Gateway Construction

The gateway is an opportunity for units to identify its campsite. Its construction, size, and complexity per the units choosing. Gateways can be as elaborate as archways or bridges, and as simple as using unit flags and banners. The importance of the gateway is to provide a formal entrance to each unit's campsite. This is not only fun and a source of unit pride and Scout spirit. This formal identification of the unit's campsite by a gateway is not required but a visible entrance should be marked and will be part of the camp awards. Awards given for the best gateways and best overall campsite.

Games

Troops will be playing Hogwarts style games in the afternoon on Saturday. The goal of these activities is to build patrol unity and help the Webelos feel the strength of working as a unit.

Dutch Oven Desert Cook-Off — Pot Luck Cracker-Barrel

Troops and Packs may enter. This will provide a competition that gives units a chance to show the variety and flavors that can be created in a Dutch Oven. The deserts will be served Saturday after the Campfire Program. In order to ensure there are enough deserts for everyone, each unit is expected to provide at least enough dessert to feed everyone in their unit.



The Wizard Journey Begins



The Cub Wizardry Starts Here:

- **Herbology** – Herbology is a Hogwarts class that focuses on the study of magical plants and fungi including their care and their magical properties and use. Some of these plants are dangerous – the cry of a mandrake can be fatal, for example, and Harry was bitten by a Fanged Geranium during his fifth year exam. Scouts will be learning about plants and trees.
- **Futuristic Weapons** – At Hogwarts, students are taught to defend themselves against dark wizards. They practice defensive and offensive spell-work by dueling with their wands. Scouts will be getting the chance to shoot a long rifle powered by invisible forces.
- **Ancient Weaponry** – At Howarts, students are also taught to master ancient devices to ward off the evil demons. They learn skills beyond their wands. The wizards in training will be shooting weaponry that followed the atlatl.
- **Defense against the Dark Arts** – Students at Hogwarts study Defense against the Dark arts so that they will have the ability to protect themselves from dangers in the magical world. They not only learn counter-curses and defensive magical theory, but also study dark creatures such as boggarts, vampires, and werewolves. Scouts will be learning how to protect themselves from dangers in the mortal world. Class will focus primarily on first aid and fire safety.
- **Potions** – Students at Hogwarts study potions which are magical compounds created by mixing various ingredients and altering their structure according to very specific rules. Examples include the Forgetfulness Potion, Confusing and Befuddlement Draughts, and extensive study of antidotes. Here, Scouts will be learning to alter ingredients for scientific experiments and for cooking.
- **Transfiguration** – Transfiguration is magic that transforms one object into another. Such as turning a beetle into a button, but be careful to not accidentally change your friend into a badger! Our Scouts will be transforming raw materials into a completed project. This will be a craft and building activity.
- **Care of Magical Creatures** – In this course, students at Hogwarts study the life cycle of various magical creatures and learn to care for, feed, and manage the creatures as well to use them for magical purposes. One such creature is the Blast-Ended Skrewt, a strange creature that looks like a giant scorpion and blows fire from one end. We'll be learning about animals and wildlife conservation.

Instructions

Minnesota Law

609.66 Dangerous weapons.

Subd. 1b. **Felony; furnishing to minors.**

Whoever, in any municipality of this state, furnishes a minor under 18 years of age with a firearm, airgun, ammunition, or explosive without the prior consent of the minor's parent or guardian or of the police department of the municipality is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than ten years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$20,000, or both. Possession of written evidence of prior consent signed by the minor's parent or guardian is a complete defense to a charge under this subdivision.

Requirements

As you can see by the law listed above the Instructors and Range Officers and Instructors acting on behalf of Northern Star Council Districts will by law need the "**Permission to Participate in Shooting Sports**" (**PPSS**) for every youth who wishes to participate. Listed below are the rules and requirements.

The unit leader is **NOT** authorized to fill out any part of the **PPSS** form, or sign for any youth except their own son or daughter.

The **PPSS** must be filled in complete and correctly by the youth's custodial parent or legal guardian. For divorced parents of a youth, we require a custodial parent's signature for legal reasons. Telephone authorization and/or signature by proxy are not allowed. The range personal require that the **original** signed **PPSS** forms be presented to them at the shooting range.

The **PPSS** will be retained by the Range personnel for their records. Remember the **original** forms are required for the event. The Instructor or Range Officer's decision to allow or NOT allow any, or all, individuals the opportunity to shoot will not be questioned.
